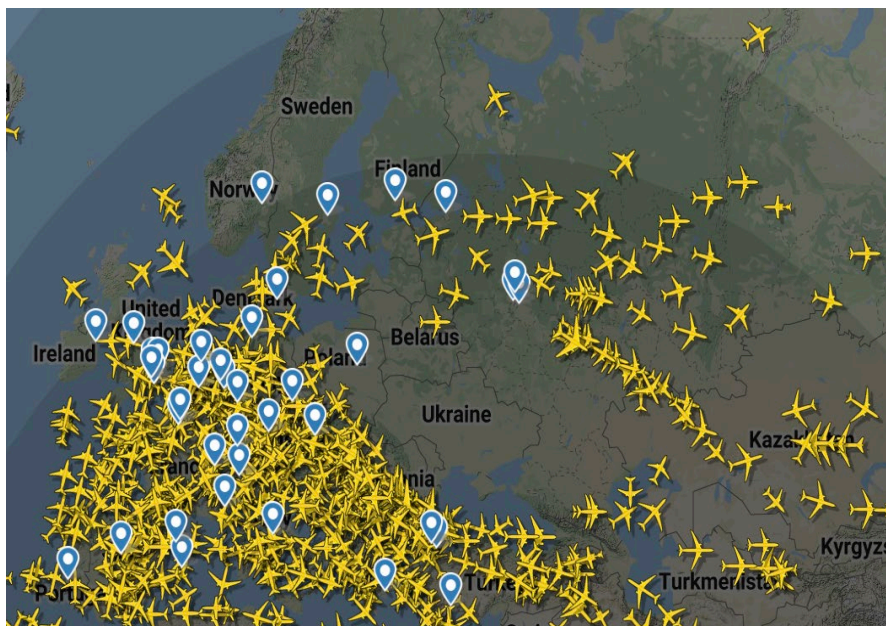

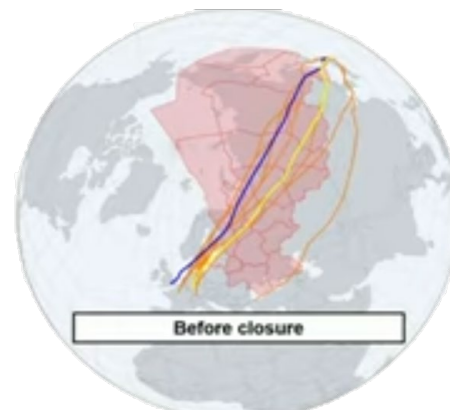
# Consequences of War for Global Aviation

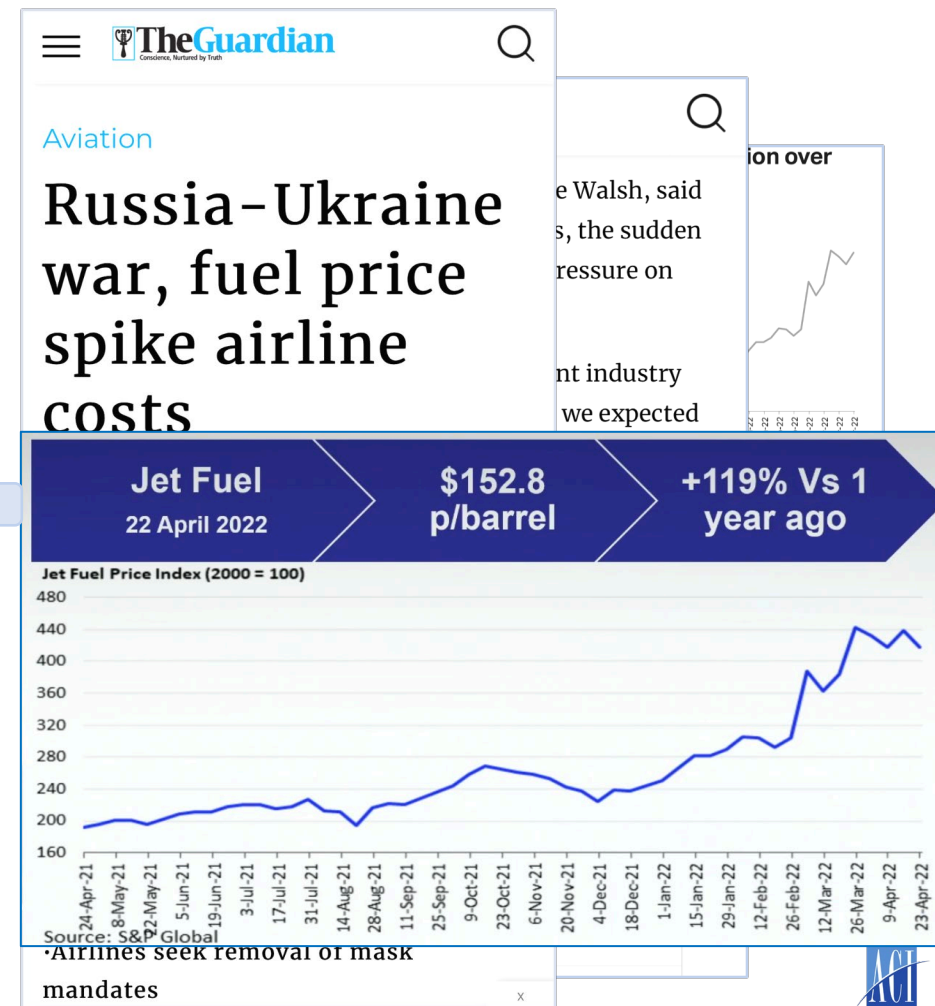


Today we have longer routes and rising fuel price

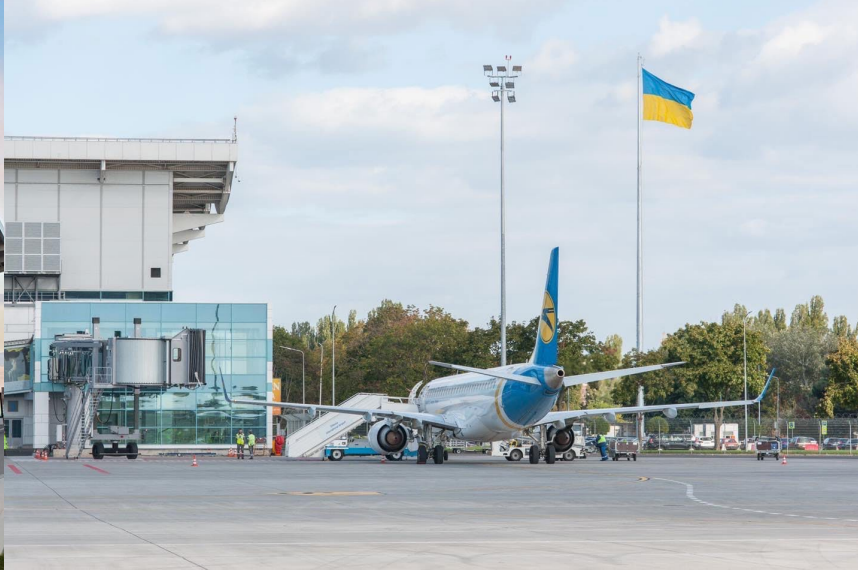

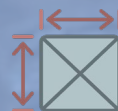

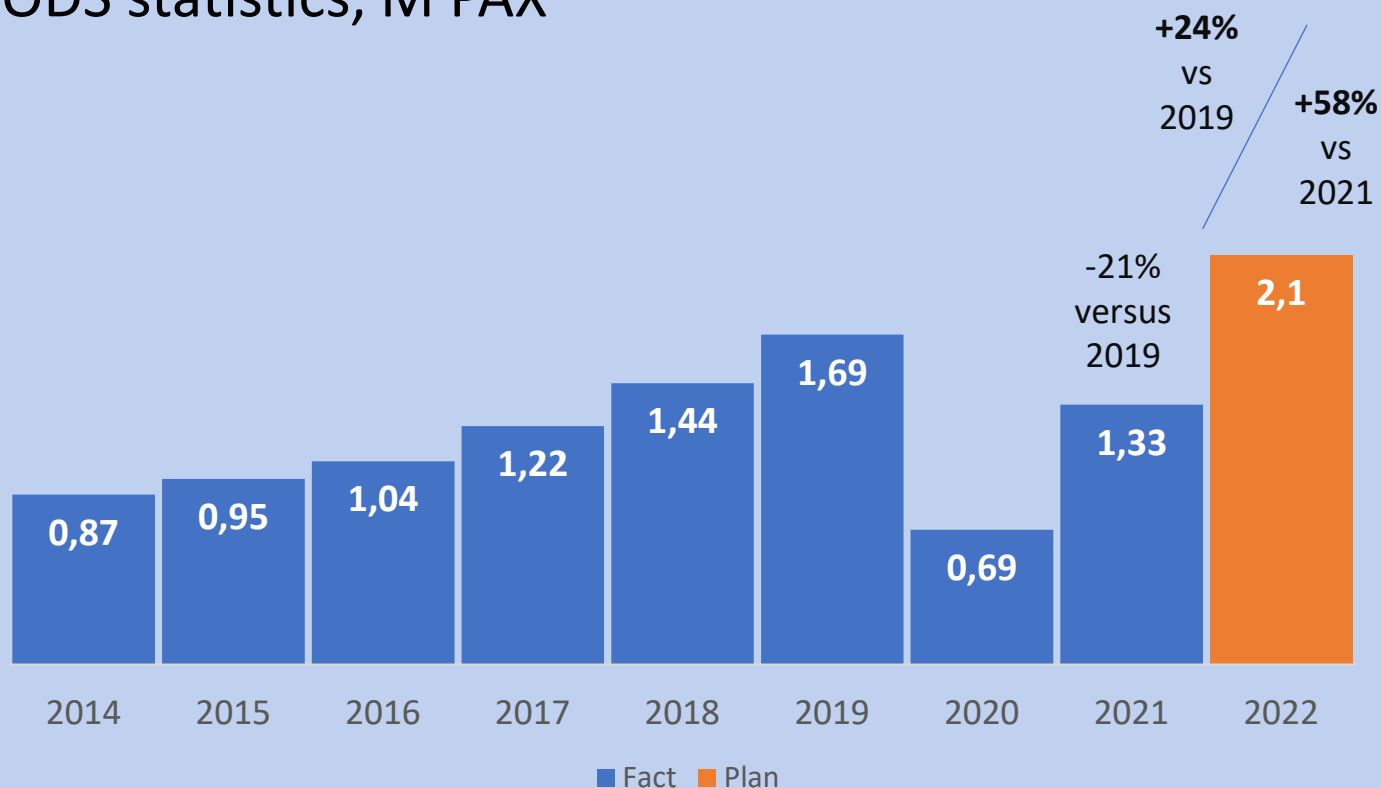

# The Preparation to a War Scenario

Recommendations  
on how to be  
prepared to a war  
scenario:

- to receive **precise instructions and regulations in case of war** from the CAA and the Ministry of Defence
- to set **direct and effective communication and coordination with CAA and military forces** responsible for an airport
- to determine **the order of interactions with concessionaires and business partners** (GHC, Fuel companies, DF, FB, car rentals, ATMs and others)
- to **appoint an airport coordinating headquarters** and assign responsibilities
- to set **effective and constant internal communication** and coordination with the staff (emergency mode, financial and other aids)
- to develop a plan of **preservation of Aerodrome facilities and evacuation of Airport equipment** (optionally)
- to **secure financial flows and IT infrastructure**
